Eligibility Criteria to Appear for **DENPET-II-2011**



- i) The candidate must be an Indian National.
- ii) The Candidate must have passed B.D.S. examination from a Dental College recognized by Dental Council of India.
- iii) The candidate must have completed the compulsory rotating internship on or before 30-04-2011. He / She will have to produce a certificate of completion of internship before joining the course.
- iv) The candidate should posses a permanent registration with any State Dental Council or Dental Council of India. If the registration certificate is not submitted within one month after admission to the postgraduate course, admission to course will be cancelled.
- v) If a candidate does not fulfill any or all the above requirements or fails to pay the fees at the time of counselling, he/she will not be considered eligible for admission irrespective of his appearing for DENPET-II 2011 examination and securing a rank in the merit list.
- vi) Foreign Nationals seeking admission for the Post Graduate course in the institution must procure temporary registration by Dental Council of India for the duration of the Postgraduate training restricted to the Dental College to which he/she is admitted.
- vii) Candidates who have passed Post Graduate Diploma course recognised by the DCI, of the duration of 2 years in particular speciality will be eligible for admission in MDS in the same speciality and the duration of his MDS course will be 2 years.

Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune

The Department of Human Resource Development, Government of India on the recommendation of University Grants Commission accorded the status of Deemed University to twelve units of Bharati Vidyapeeth (vide their notification No. F.9-15/95-U.3 dated 26/4/96 under the Section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act. of 1956).

Subsequently, the Govt. of India on the recommendations of the UGC and AICTE brought three more institutions of Bharati Vidyapeeth within the ambit of Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University vide their letter No. F9-15/95-U3 dated 28th July, 2000. The University Grants Commission vide their Letter No. F.No. 3-2/90 CPP-1 dated 17th August 2002, have agreed to bring two more research institutions within the ambit of Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University. A Medical College at Sangli and a Dental College at Navi Mumbai have also been brought within the ambit of this Deemed University by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India vide its notification dt. 19th August, 2004. In Feb. 2005 once again Govt. of India vide notification No. F9-16/2004U3 dated 25th Feb. 2005 brought following seven Institutes under the ambit of Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University.

Since Govt. of India on the recommendation of UGC and AICTE has given the status of deemed university to Bharati Vidyapeeth, its degrees and diplomas have the same status as of those given by any statutory University that are recognised by the U.G.C. Moreover, our colleges of professional education viz. the Medical College, the Dental College and others have their degrees recognised by the respective statutory councils viz. Medical Council of India etc. and also by the State and Central Governments.

Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune commenced its functioning w.e.f. 26th April, 1996. So far we admitted fifteen batches of students to our Medical, Dental, Ayurved, Homoeopathy and other Colleges/Institutes as students of Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University. In the last fifteen years the process of admission to our Medical, Dental, Ayurved, Homoeopathy Colleges was successfully completed. As a crowning glory to all this Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University has received "A" grade accreditation by National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) at autonomous body of UGC.

Ragging in Dental Institutions: As per directives given by Dental Council of India 'If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from institutions". Please note this rule should be strictly followed.

















Our Campuses

Dental College & Hospital, Navi Mumbai

Our Dental College was established in 1989 to fulfill aspirations of students from the region to obtain professional education. This was the first such private initiative in the state of Maharashtra. In 1993, the Dental Council of India recognized the B.D.S. degree of our dental college. Since then we have made great strides in terms of faculty, infrastructure and academic reputation. The college is housed in a building having an area of 207000 sq.ft. including Post Graduate and Research wing. All our graduates have made a name for themselves in practice, employment and higher studies; in India as well as abroad.

The Government of India in concurrence with the Dental Council of India has permitted Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Dental College, Pune to conduct the post graduate courses in the following subjects. The courses & seat distribution is as follows:

The duration of MDS course will be of 3 academic years on full time basis.

Foreign / NRI / Management Seats:

Fifty percent seats are reserved under Foreign / NRI / Management Category. Candidates seeking admissions to the seats of this category will have to purchase the **DENPET-II-2011** bruchure for regular category and also have to apply separately on prescribed application form (Fee Rs. 1000/-) and submit the same to The Registrar, Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune. Seats remaining vacant after allotment to Foreign / NRI students will be allotted to Indian students under management category on the basis of merit based on the marks obtained by them in **DENPET-II-2011**. The last date for submission of form to this category is before 5.00 p.m.



Admission Procedure

- 1. The admissions to M.D.S. Course to the Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Dental College & Hospital, Navi Mumbai will be made on the basis of merit obtained by the candidate in dental postgraduate entrance test i.e.
 - DENPET-II-2011.
- 2. Eligibility for subsequent admission: The candiate should secure at least 50% marks in DENPET. The candidate belonging to SC/ST should secure at least 40% marks in DENPET, in addition to the eligibility criteria mentioned on page 6.

In case of candidates having equal marks in DENPET-II-2011 the following procedure shall be adopted as a tie-breaker:

- (i) First preference to the candidates on the basis of higher marks obtained in the final B.D.S. examination.
- (ii) In case of equal marks in (1) above, preference will be decided on grand total of marks secured by the candidate at I, II, III and final B.D.S. examinations.
- (iii) If equal, preference shall be decided on the basis of total marks secured by the candidate at the XII Std. examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects taken together.
- (iv) If equal, preference shall be decided on the basis of total marks obtained by the candidate in the XII Std. examination.
- 3. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is notice later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he shall be expelled from the educational institution
- 4. DENPET-II will be conducted at Centers in Pune, New Delhi and Navi Mumbai on the addresses given on Cover 3.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A candidate desirous of applying for DENPET-II-2011, is required to complete the prescribed form appended at the end of this Brochure. The same must reach Registrar, Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Bharati Vidyapeeth Bhavan, Lal Bahadur Shastri Marg, Pune 411 030 on or before the date of submission mentioned in the calender of events. (Cover 3)


All candidates are required to enclose attested photocopies of the following documents duly attested by Principal/Gazetted Officer along with the form:

- i) Statement of marks of I, II, III and final B.D.S. examinations
- ii) Certificate of completion of internship
- iii) Certificate indicating the number of attempts at final B.D.S. examination from the Head of the Institution
- iv) If the candidate is employed, he should submit 'No Objection Certificate' from the employer
- v) Declaration stating that he is not undergoing any postgraduate course at other institution


- vi) Medical fitness certificate
- vii) Statement of marks of 10+2 or equivalent examination
- viii) Certificate of registration with State Dental Council/Dental Council of India.
- ix) Nationality certificate
- x) Transfer Certificate
- xi) Migration certificate
- xii) Certificate from the Dean / Principal of the dental college of the candidate stating, that college is recognised by the Dental Council of India.
- xiii) Caste Certificate.
- xiv) Caste Validity Certificate from appropriate authority.
- xv) Photo Identity Card issued by any Govt. Agency (PAN Card, Driving Liscence, Passport etc.)

SYLLABUS

The question paper of DENPET-II will contain 200 multiple choice questions of one correct or most appropriate choice type, out of 4 choices. The questions will be on the syllabi prescribed for the I,II,III and final B.D.S. examinations, with more weightage given to clinical subjects. Each correct answer will get 3 marks, There is no negative marking. No marks will be deducted for unanswered questions. (Please see ANNEXURE for detailed instruction on **DENPET-II-2011**)

D) Name of the candidate: The name should be identical to that given in the B.D.S. degree certificate. Write in BLOCK LETTERS only. Leave one blank block between adjacent words. For example, shrikar mukund mate should be written as:

- F) Address for communication: Do not repeat your name. The telephone number should follow the STD code, with a dash or a blank box. PINCODE MUST BE INCLUDED.
- G) Photograph: A recent passport size photograph to be affixed at the appropriate place in the application form. The photograph should be firmly affixed by using gum and should not be pinned. The photograph should be attested by the Head of the Institution or by a Gazetted Officer. Care should be taken to see that the attestation is done at the bottom part of the photograph and the photograph is not defaced.
- H) It is essential to mark the category (Point no. 7) by the candidate. The application form must also accompany cast validity certificate in case of SC and ST candidates.

- J) The application has to be signed by the applicant.

CONDUCT OF THE DENPET-II

- 1. The Test will be conducted at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Dental College & Hospital, Pune-Satara Road, Pune-411 043. and on the addresses of the respective centres given on Cover 3. The candidate must report at the centre at least 60 minutes before the time of commencement of examination.
- 2. THE EXAMINATION HALL WILL BE OPENED 30 MINUTES BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE TEST. CANDIDATES ARE EXPECTED TO TAKE THEIR SEATS 15 MINUTES BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE EXAMINATION. IF THE CANDIDATES DO NOT REPORT IN TIME THEY ARE LIKELY TO MISS SOME OF THE GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BE ANNOUNCED IN THE EXAMINATION HALL.
- 3. A candidate who comes late by 30 minutes or more after the commencement of the examination will not be permitted to appear for the examination.
- 4. The candidate must show, on demand, the admission card for admission to the examination hall. A candidate who does not possess the admission card issued by the Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune will not be admitted to the examination hall under any circumstances by the Centre Superintendent.
- 5. A candidate will not be allowed to carry any textual material, printed or written, bits of papers or any other material except the admission card inside the examination hall. Also, candidates will not be permitted to bring calculators, slide rules, Clerk tables, electronic watches with facilities of calculators, laptop computers, personal stereo systems, walkie-talkie sets, paging devices, cell phones and any other object/device that is likely to be of unfair assistance.
- 6. No candidate, will be allowed to go outside the examination hall till the completion of the entire duration of examination. Once the candidate leaves the room (even if only to answer a call of nature) he/she will not be readmitted under any circumstances.
- 7. Candidates are advised to bring with them a card board or a clip board, on which nothing should be written, so that they have no difficulty in writing responses in the answer sheet even if the tables provided in the examination hall do not have smooth surface. They must have their own blue or black ball pens.
- 8. Smoking in the examination centre is strictly prohibited. Beverages or snacks of any kind are not allowed to be taken into the examination halls during examination hours.
- 9. Candidates shall maintain complete silence and attend to their paper only. Any conversation or gesticulation or disturbance in the examination hall shall be deemed as misbehaviour and if a candidate is found using unfair means or impersonation, his/her candidature will be cancelled and he/she will be liable to be debarred for taking examination either permanently or for a specified period according to the nature of offence.

- 11. After completing the Test and before handing over the Test Booklet and the Answer Sheet to the invigilator, the candidate should check again that all the particulars required in the Test Booklet and the Answer Sheet have been correctly written. Ensure that the Roll Number is correctly written in the answer sheet.
- 12. A warning bell will be given at the beginning of the examination and at the half-time. A warning bell will also be given before the closing time when the candidate must stop marking the responses.

MODE OF THE TEST

- 13 The examination will be of 3 hours duration and will consist of one question paper of 600 marks consisting of 200 questions.
- 14. The test is of objective type. The candidate will be provided with a sealed Test Booklet and an Answer Sheet. The candidate will write with ball point pen the required information regarding: Name and Roll Number on the Test Booklet and on the Answer Sheet.
- 15. In the Test Booklet, there will be 200 questions serially numbered from 001 to 200. Each question will be followed by four responses marked (A), (B), (C) and (D).
